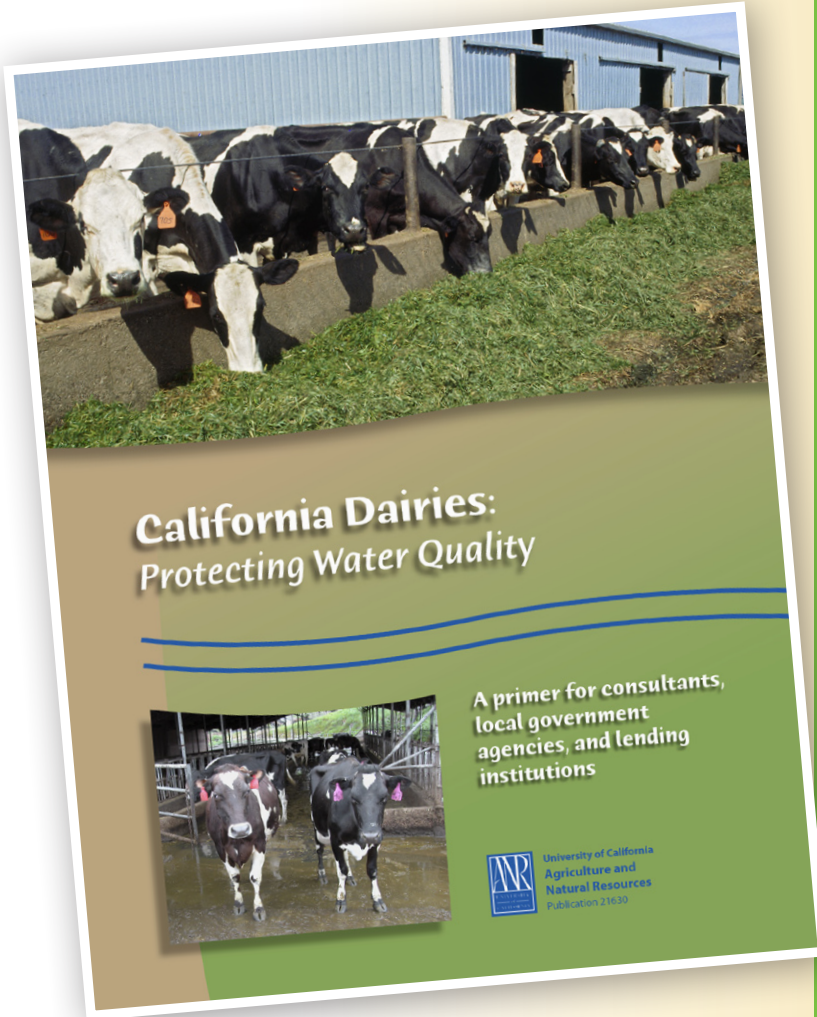

This handy guide is a primer for consultants, local agencies, and lending institutions on practical approaches and technologies that have been used by progressive dairy producers to protect surface and groundwater quality.

Since each dairy is different, practices must be tailored to each situation. This guide discusses three types of dairies – dairies with irrigated cropland, dairies with non-irrigated pasture and hay fields, and dairies with limited cropland – and outlines a variety of management measures for each.
